Words from Fr Brendan Clover

Dear friends,

Writing on the readings for this Sunday Pope Benedict has this to say:

'The words of the Apostle Paul, which today the liturgy proposes for our meditation, resound in my mind: 'We preach Christ crucified: a stumbling block to Jews and folly to Gentiles, but to those who are called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ [is] the power of God and the wisdom of God.' I have nothing to propose or give to those whom I shall meet except Christ and the Good News of his Cross, a mystery of supreme love, of divine love that overcomes all human resistance and even makes forgiveness and love for one's enemies possible. This is the grace of the Gospel that is capable of transforming the world. The Church, therefore, does not pursue economic, social or political objectives; the Church proclaims Christ, certain that the Gospel can move the hearts of all and transform them, thereby renewing people and societies from within.'

It strikes me, as I ponder the situation in too many parts of our world, that this is a helpful message which gives us hope.

Next week there will be more clues as the art piece develops. Can you guess what the final piece will look like when it is finished?

SCHOOL VISITS TO CHURCH – HELP NEEDED PLEASE!

Two visits are planned for children from St John's school.

The first is on **Thursday 7 March** for 5 to 7 year olds. The children will be introduced to the importance and meaning of Mothering Sunday and will then be encouraged to make a variety of appropriate crafts. Parents will be invited to attend a short service at 14.25 when children will read prayers they have prepared. At the end of the session the children will serve their mothers/carers with tea, coffee and cake in the Church Hall. We will need help setting up in Church and in the Hall (set up beginning at 11.30), welcoming pupils at 13.15 and assisting with craft activities at 13.55. It would be good to have help when the parents arrive at 14.25 and with clearing up at the end (15.00).

The second visit will take place on **Friday 22 March** for 7 to 9 year olds. It will follow a similar format where Fr Brendan will explain Palm Sunday and children will then make a donkey mask and a palm leaf containing a personal prayer. Tea and coffee will be served at the back of the Church to parents/carers after a short service. Again we will need help setting up (11.30), welcoming pupils (13.15) assisting with crafts (14.00), welcoming parents (14.30), serving refreshments (14.45) and clearing up (15.00).

Please speak to Sarah if you are able to help in any way at either of the sessions. Thank you.





St John's 100 Club
