

Words from Fr Brendan Clover

Dear friends,

On Sunday Passiontide begins. The statues and crucifixes are veiled, but not the icons, and the season takes on a more somber feel. Please avail yourself of the opportunities we have to come close to Christ in his Passion in the parish. Mass is offered every day, Stations are Tuesdays and Sundays, and our Lent course has two sessions to go at 5.30pm on

The timetable for the services of Holy Week is published in this Newsletter. On Holy Monday the Bishop of Chichester will preside at the Chrism Mass in Bristol Cathedral at Noon. At this Eucharist bishops, priests and deacons renew their vows, and the holy oils are consecrated for use in the parishes. It would be lovely if some of you were able to attend this service as a sign of our solidarity one with another.

I am looking for volunteers; volunteers to take part in the Passion on Palm Sunday and Good Friday, and volunteers to have their feet washed at the Liturgy of the Last Supper. Please have a word with me if you are able to do either of these things. And we must make sure that the Watch of the Sacred Passion on Maundy Thursday, which ends at Midnight, has people there. 'Could you not watch with me one hour?' asks the Lord. There will be a sheet for you to commit to a time at the back of the church. Finally on Sunday 24th April we have our APCM. We need people to serve on our PCC, and we need a new warden as Nick is stepping down. Is serving on the PCC something you might consider? Most of the work is done in the three committees

and the PCC meets only four times a year, though we did have a strategy day in addition last September. Have a word with me or any current

member of the PCC if you are interested. It would be very good to broaden the base from which we are

RECOMMENDED LENT READING

Entering the Twofold Mystery by Eric Varden

Erik Varden became Bishop of Trondheim in his native Norway on 2019. This, his second book, is a meditation on the religious life, on the life of Christ, and the call to live in community.

The Archbishop of Canterbury's Lent Book this year is

Embracing Justice by Isabelle Hamley. Isabelle is the Archbishop's former chaplain, now theological adviser to the House of Bishops. Her knowledge as an Old Testament scholar shines forth in the first three chapters on Genesis, Exodus and liberation. The remaining chapters deal with the Incarnation, the Crucifixion and Holy Communion.

in **The Way of the Franciscans - A Prayer Journey through Lent** Daniel Horan offers insights from Franciscans across the ages. There are questions for reflection or discussion.

Richard Harries, former Bishop of Oxford, offers us **Hearing God in poetry** - **Fifty poems for Lent and Easter.** Each chapter is a poem and a short reflection on the poet, poem and some gentle theology. Henry Martin is a retired prison chaplain retired to France where he devotes his time to writing, painting, his husband and their dog. **Vincent van Gogh and the Good Samaritan** recalls Henri Nouwen's classic on the prodigal son.


