

Words from Fr Brendan Clover

Dear friends,

On Trinity Sunday the Liturgy invites us to praise God not merely for the wonders that he has worked, but for who he is; for the beauty and goodness of his being from which his action stems. We are invited to contemplate, so to speak, the Hearty of God, his deepest reality which is his being One in the Trinity, a supreme and profound communion of love and life. The whole of Sacred Scripture speaks of him. Indeed, it is he who speaks to us of himself in the Scriptures and reveals himself as Creator of the Universe and Lord of history.

On Sunday we will hear a passage from the book of Exodus in which - something quite exceptional - God proclaims his own Name! He does so in the presence of Moses which whom he spoke face to face, as with a friend.

And what is God's name? It never fails to move us: 'The Lord, the Lord, a God merciful and gracious, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness.'

This God is worthy of our worship... and there are many opportunities for us to do so in this parish. Let's make worship a priority.


CHANGES TO MASS TIMES




Fund Raise as You Shop
