

Words from Fr Brendan Clover

Dear friends,

As we celebrate our 'new' Patronal Festival I thought it might be worth thinking about our parish and what it is we are seeking to achieve.

A parish community is first and foremost a group of people who have a strong sense of being called together by Jesus Christ, the Son of God.

The most important things about us provide some answers to a simple question: **Why do we bother?**

First, because we believe in God. This compels us to speak about the nature of creation, the purpose of life, our values, being human with dignity and justice, and our utter conviction in the reality of life beyond death.

Second, because we take spiritual things seriously. That prompts us to worship and to pray. Beauty, love, goodness and all things that enrich life: these form the atmosphere of our worship, weekly and daily. Our worship is, or should be transformational, lifting us beyond the cares and concerns of everyday life into the beauty of holiness. Finally, because we are pledged to be a presence in this community, and to promote the common good here. We are the 'Town Church', and this church was founded and provided to serve the town of Clevedon. This isn't an option or a 'nice to do' - this is our mission, to reach out to those around us and to incarnate and to share the love of God. People might not respond... but we have an obligation, because of our baptism, to share the faith we have received. This is the theme of so many of the Easter readings. 'Go out ... proclaim the Good News!' Our church building in all its beauty tells the story of our predecessors and of their courage and confidence in the future of the Church. Our school has been providing children with free, high quality Christian education for over 100 years. Priests and others who assist them baptize children, care for the sick, minister to the dying, celebrate the last rites, and preside at funerals; they will celebrate your marriages, bless your homes and simply be available in times of distress or festivity.

We are the Parish of St John the Evangelist, and our prayer must be that God will show us the path to life in its perfection and glory.

80th Bishop of Bath and Wells announced



Downing Street has announced today (10am, 28 April 2022) that the Rt Revd Michael Beasley will be the next Bishop of Bath and Wells. He is currently the Bishop of Hertford, a role which he has held since 2015.

Prior to taking a fulltime role with the church, Bishop Michael was an epidemiologist, a background he was called on to use during the pandemic as a member of the Church of England's Covid task force.

Bishop Michael is already familiar with Somerset. His wife Lizzie is from a farming family from Somerset and prior to Bishop Michael being interviewed for the role of Bishop of Bath and Wells, they both undertook a 60 mile walk around the county.

Speaking in advance of today's announcement, Bishop Michael shared his joy in becoming the 80th Bishop of Bath and Wells and said he was looking forward to getting to know the people of Somerset.

Parish Administrator & PA to the Parish Priest

Fr. Brendan and the Churchwardens are pleased to announce that we have successfully recruited June Fegredo to the new role of Parish Administrator.
