Words from Fr Brendan Clover

Dear friends,

We look forward to having Bishop Jonathan with us on Sunday at the 10.30am Parish Mass when we shall keep the Feast of the Passion of St John the Evangelist, our patron saint

On this occasion we will solemnly receive the Bishop, so I thought I should tell you about this ceremony.

The Bishop and servers will arrive at the south door, and, on entering the church the Bishop kneels at a *prie deux* (if I can find one!). He then venerates a crucifix by kissing it and sprinkles himself with holy water. Normally he would then sprinkle all of us with the blessed water, but this is not allowed under COVID restrictions.

Next, he blesses incense and I, as Parish Priest, honour him with incense. I'm sure you already get the symbolism.

- The crucifix is a reminder of the One whose servants and apostles we all
- The water reminds us of our baptism, of the moment we became part of the mystical body of Christ.
- And the incense reminds us that we are temples of the Holy Spirit. The Bishop is a particular temple of the Holy Spirit, because he stands in succession with the apostles, and, by the power of the Holy Spirit (symbolised in the mitre, which is the shape of a flame of fire) he consecrates and confirms.

Whilst all of this is taking place (if you are allowed by copyright) we hear the anthem 'Ecce sacerdos magnus, qui in diebus suis placuit Deo. Ideo jurejurando fecit illum Dominus crescere in plebem suam. Benedictionem omnium gentium dedit illi et testamentum suum confirmavit super caput ejus.'

Behold a great priest, who in his days pleased God. Therefore, by an oath, the Lord made him increase among his people. He gave him the blessing of all nations and confirmed his covenant upon his head.

If you don't know it, Anton Bruckner wrote the most amazing setting of these words.

So, it should be a splendid beginning to a special day when we celebrate our Patron Saint as never before... please be at Mass if you possibly can.

Covid-19 Restrictions

Please be reminded the following applies to our worship in church so we can remain open.

- If you have symptoms please stay at home and worship with us on-line (all our services are Livestreamed).
- Masks must be worn (if you cannot wear a mask please consider a visor)

- Please provide your contact details for Track and Trace or use the QR code

- Please refrain from entering the Vestry, this is for Clergy and Servers only.
- Keep the South doorway clear for others to exit and do not re-enter the church once left.

Wellspring Counselling has been caring for people across North Somerset since 1994. The service provides affordable, professional counselling for adults as well as donation-based counselling for young people aged 11 to 18.

Wellspring has counsellors available to help adults with a wide range of concerns, including anxiety, depression, relationship issues, abuse and bereavement. All counsellors are professionally trained, have regular clinical supervision and engage in Continued Professional Development.

Since the pandemic hit and the country first went into lockdown in March, Wellspring has adapted its services and is currently working with clients remotely, offering the option of video calls or telephone sessions during the day or evening. The continuation of this much-needed service has been a lifeline for many who have been struggling with their mental health in these difficult and unprecedented times.
