#### Words from Fr Brendan Clover

Dear friends,

Holy Week is magnificent, challenging, powerful, exhausting, intriguing and utterly remarkable! Each year we dive out of our own space and time to be immersed in the great events of salvation — not as a memory or a story, but as a reality which changes our lives and world in a way beyond imagining. Much of this is achieved through the celebration of the liturgy.

The three days ('Triduum') of THURSDAY, FRIDAY and SATURDAY, are the climax of the whole Christian year – the celebration of the paschal mystery. The Jewish Pasch or Passover from slavery in Egypt to freedom in the Promised Land anticipated and prefigured our Passover from the darkness and slavery of sin to the light of new life in Christ. The three days make up one single celebration of our one Passover from death to life.

Each day we focus on a different aspect of that one Passover. On MAUNDY THURSDAY we celebrate the signs of the new covenant – the sacraments. We celebrate especially the Eucharist in which Christ gives himself for us: 'This is my body which will be given up for you.' The sacrifice of the 'new and eternal covenant' between God and his people. But also, since liturgy must flow out of and into life, we celebrate and show our love for others. The love we show is a sign of the covenant of love between us and God.

On GOOD FRIDAY we celebrate Christ as our Paschal Lamb who takes away the sin of the world.
On HOLY SATURDAY NIGHT – the most important moment of the year – we celebrate the fulfilment of Christ's Passover from death to life and our Passover with him to new life. The liturgy of the Triduum is the way we celebrate publicly the Easter Mystery. It commemorates not only the historical events but celebrates and makes present their saving effect for us in our parish in 2022.

I cannot overstate how important and significant these celebrations are for each one of us as we celebrate our membership of the Body of Christ.

#### RECOMMENDED LENT READING

#### **Entering the Twofold Mystery** by Eric Varden

Erik Varden became Bishop of Trondheim in his native Norway on 2019. This, his second book, is a meditation on the religious life, on the life of Christ, and the call to live in community.

The Archbishop of Canterbury's Lent Book this year is

**Embracing Justice** by Isabelle Hamley. Isabelle is the Archbishop's former chaplain, now theological adviser to the House of Bishops. Her knowledge as an Old Testament scholar shines forth in the first three chapters on Genesis, Exodus and liberation. The remaining chapters deal with the Incarnation, the Crucifixion and Holy Communion.

in **The Way of the Franciscans - A Prayer Journey through Lent** Daniel Horan offers insights from Franciscans across the ages. There are questions for reflection or discussion.

Richard Harries, former Bishop of Oxford, offers us **Hearing God in poetry** - **Fifty poems for Lent and Easter.** Each chapter is a poem and a short reflection on the poet, poem and some gentle theology. Henry Martin is a retired prison chaplain retired to France where he devotes his time to writing, painting, his husband and their dog. **Vincent van Gogh and the Good Samaritan** recalls Henri Nouwen's classic on the prodigal son.





#### NOTICE OF A MEETING FOR

#### THE ELECTION OF CHURCHWARDENS

Parish of CLEVEDON ST JOHN

.A. meeting for the election of chaurchwardens will be held in

on 24 day of April at 11.15 am (after Mass)

This meeting may be attended by:

- 1. All persons whose mames are entered on the church electoral roll of the parish and
- 2. All persons resident in the parish whose names are entered on a register of local government elector's by reason of such residence.

Under section 5A of the Church wardens' Measure 2001,<sup>1</sup> an appeal against the election of a churchwarden may be made by any person entitled to take part in this meeting or by a candidate in the election. An appeal may be made against the election of any person on any of the following grounds:

- 1. That the person was not cluly elected,
- 2. That the person was not qualified to be a candidate at the time of election,
- 3. That before the election was held, the person misrepresented a material fact in connection with the election.
- 4. That the conduct of the election was such as to affect its outcome,
- 5. That it has been determined that an error was made in the roll or that question is awaiting determination, and that error would or might be material to the election result;
- 6. That a vote which was all lowed should have been disallowed, or that should have been disallowed was allowed, but only if that would or might have been material to the election result.

Any person who wishes to make an appeal should consult the Minister or the lay chair of the deanery Synod as to the appropriate procedure.
