ANNOUNCEMENT FROM THE ARCHDEACON OF BATH

As you are aware, Fr Brendan is currently the Interim Minister at St Johns, Clevedon until April 2024. All Saints Weston Super *Mare, also a Society parish, has recently* become vacant. Fr Brendan has been asked to also be the Interim Minister of All Saints WSM until April 2024 alongside his role at St Johns. This interim period will allow the current Deanery discussions about clergy deployment and possible pastoral reorganizations to continue, and to conclude, before any permanent decisions are made. Fr Brendan has very graciously agreed to take up this extension to his interim ministry, This has taken place in consultation with the wardens of both parishes. Fr Brendan will work closely with both parishes, their PCCs and officers, and seek to give appropriate and proportionate time to each as we discern the way forward and look for evangelistic and mission opportunities in the two communities. As those of you at St Johns already know, Fr Brendan is an excellent priest. He has done wonderful work at St John's over the last two years, and I trust he will be able to use his gifts to help grow the work at All Saints Weston Super Mare too. Dear friends,

This year, the Third Sunday of Lent, the liturgy again presents one of the most profound passages of the Bible: the dialogue between Jesus and the Samaritan woman. The Samaritan woman represents the existential dissatisfaction of one who does not find what he seeks. She had 'five husbands' and now she lives with another man; her going to and from the well to draw water expresses a repetitive and resigned life. However, everything changes for her that day thanks to the conversation with the Lord Jesus. Like the Samaritan woman, let us also open our hearts to listen trustingly to God's Word in order to encounter Jesus who reveals his love to us and tells us: 'I who speak to you am he', the Messiah, your Saviour.

We are well into Lent now, but it is never too late to commit to a closer walk with Christ by attending a weekday mass or devotion. See the notice below.


LENT LUNCH

Don't forget the Lent lunch in the Vicarage after the Thursday Market Mass. Soup and a bread roll with donations to Clevedon Food Bank.



Do you have talents and experience to share?

After many years of loyal and dedicated service to this parish and the PCC, with much sadness we are saying farewell to our PCC Secretary, Sue and our Treasurer, Fiona at the Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM) in April. Sue and Fiona have done a fabulous job at keeping the PCC on track procedurally and financially. We thank them so much for all they have done for St John's Church.

We are now in search of replacements for Sue and Fiona, who are difficult acts to follow. However, both these roles are supported by the diocese who run an induction programme, regular updates, access to the diocese Finance Department and the Diocesan Secretary's office, plus buddies in similar roles in other parishes, and the support of the Churchwardens, PCC Chair and relevant sub-committees at St John's.

We hope the following provides a brief insight into the roles we are looking to fill:

PCC Secretary

The primary responsibilities of a PCC Secretary are to support the PCC Chair in the preparation and organisation of meetings and to handle all correspondence on behalf of the PCC. The Diocesan Office contacts the parish from time to time to request specific information, every effort is made to keep this to a minimum and all meeting agendas are issued and minutes stored electronically using Microsoft Office.

PCC Treasurer

You do not need to have been a treasurer of an organisation before. In many respects it is not to dissimilar from keeping good control of household finances, however, if you have an understanding of some accountancy practice it will be useful but not essential. This role implements decisions made the PCC. This role is also supported with dioceses induction training for new treasurers, updates and continued support throughout the financial year for all financial procedures and processes.
