

Words from Fr Brendan Clover

Dear friends,

The first 'bounden duty' I have this week is to thank all those who were involved in the celebration of Pentecost and the Queen's Platinum Jubilee in our parish. We kicked off last Thursday with the lunchtime Mass and celebratory refreshments at the Vicarage. We prayed for HM at the Friday Mass and at the Saturday Mass when we also dedicated a new oak plinth for the Sacrament House or Tabernacle which has graciously been given in memory of Claire Day by her family. I feel much relieved that the Sacrament House (on permanent loan to us by the Guild of St Mary and St Anne) is on a surer footing. And we can now release the coffin stool it was sitting on back to its original purpose! These three weekday Masses were well attended, so thank you.

But Sunday was the climax! A beautiful Mass with Fr Mark speaking to us about the 'power of Three'. It could also have been a sermon suitable for the Holy Trinity this Sunday, but John Andrews will enlighten us about that. Fr Mark's sermon is available to you to keep. And the Parish Picnic can only be described as having been 'spectacular'! Not only was it a spectacle with everyone is celebratory clothing and hats, but the food was sumptuous. 




Offertory Collection

Clevedon Foodbank is still in need of donations to support people in need in Clevedon and the surrounding area. Rising prices for electricity, gas, petrol and food add to the difficulties of those affected by illness, disability, bereavement, unemployment or low wages.

During the 6-week school summer holidays, they anticipate that they will give out over 300 lunch bag parcels to school-aged children to fill the gap without school meals. The majority of the items listed below will be used in the lunch bag parcels. If you would like to donate any of the items, it would be appreciated.

Over 90% of the food distributed by foodbanks in The Trussell Trust network is donated by the public – that's why your food donations are absolutely vital to their ability to give everyone referred to them a balanced and nutritious three day supply of food.

Donations of food may be brought to church and put into the purple bin in the porch, taken to the Food Bank depot in Knowles Road on Monday or Friday mornings, or put into the collection bin at Tesco's in Clevedon (Sainsbury's in Portishead, Waitrose in Nailsea). Tesco's add 20% to the value of donations.

"A Blind Date? The beginnings of Anglican/Roman Catholic Dialogue, 1921-1925"

The lecture (at 4pm) marks the centenary of the Malines Conversations which began the modern dialogue between the Anglican Church and the Roman Catholic Church. Those conversations were in large part inspired by the friendship between Dr Armitage Robinson, Dean of Wells, and two Abbots of Downside, Cuthbert Butler and Leander Ramsey. Those early discussions have led in part to the significant process in reconciliation and closer cooperation seen today between the churches.

There will be an opportunity to put questions to Bishop Rowan and to have conversations with him during the afternoon.
