Words from Fr Brendan Clover

Dear friends,

This is to be a busy week in the parish.

On **Tuesday**, the Feast of the Exultation of the Holy Cross, we welcome clergy from the locality to the Chapter meeting of the Society of the Holy Cross. After the 10am Mass there will be the opportunity for silent prayer before the Blessed Sacrament. At noon the brethren celebrate the Chapter Mass. This is followed by lunch and a meeting.

The Society of the Holy Cross - or SSC from the Latin Societas Sanctae Crucis - is a Congregation of priests in the Anglican Communion, who live and minister under a common Rule of Life. There are currently over 750 members around the world in parishes, missions, chaplaincies, schools and other areas of pastoral ministry, committed to witnessing to the Cross of Christ by their lives and ministry.

The Society of the Holy Cross (SSC) was founded in London in 1855 by a small group of Anglo-Catholic priests led by Father Charles Lowder. At a time when the Catholic Revival in the Church of England was threatened by persecution and misunderstanding, these priests came together for support, mutual prayer and encouragement. Fr Lowder spelled out the objects of SSC: "To defend and strengthen the spiritual life of the clergy, to defend the faith of the Church, and to carry on and aid Mission work both at home and abroad".

The members of this society, meeting together as they did in prayer and conference, were deeply impressed with the tensions existing in the Church, and saw also, in the remedies adopted by St Vincent de Paul, the hope of lessening them. SSC is not a devotional guild but takes its stance upon a shared vision of: 'a disciplined priestly life fashioned after a definite spiritual rule.'

St John's Repairs and Maintenance Programme

No doubt you have seen the scaffolding around the church since the end of July and the progress the painters and roofers have made during this time. This work has been outstanding since our 2014 Quinquennial i.e. 5 Year Building Survey and well over due. The PCC have been endeavouring to get this work done since in 2019, (another victim of the Covid lockdown), however, the renovation and painting of the gutters, rain water goods and replacement of lost slates is nearly complete. The PCC are sure you will agree the church looks so much better for this work.

Thank you to Martin who managed the tendering process and for liaising with the contractors.

You will also have notice a trench has been dug along the path on the west-side of the church. This is to provide access for the repair of a leaking gas pipe that was assessed by Wales and West Utilities and deemed the responsibility of the PCC to fund the repair.

Thank you to Nick for digging out the trench and to both Nick and Fiona for providing the digger. The repair is due to take place on Monday.

More scaffolding! Next week you will see the erection of scaffolding around the church hall, to address the problem we have experienced over the last few years. Squirrels have taken a liking to chewing the lead on the roof, lifting it and gaining access to the hall electrics. In so doing, they have caused considerable damage to the electric cabling in the roof space.

You will also have noticed that our church doors, benches and gates are looking as good as new. Thank you to Derek Coaker for the time he has taken to revive and repaint our woodwork and ironmongery.

Thank you to Sam and Nick Dixon for the voluntary work they have undertaken over the last couple of years and in advance of the work planned for next week to make our hall compliant and safe.
