Words from Fr Brendan Clover

Dear friends,

As I write this, I am taking a small part in a National Conference for people involved in chaplaincy in schools and colleges, hosted on the internet. I am to lead Compline from the centre stage to end the day.

We have just had a keynote address from Timothy Radcliffe, the Dominican theologian. He was addressing the theme of 'hope', part of the Conference theme. He said something truly memorable... that the Eucharist is the great sacrament of hope. And he then placed the Last Supper in the context of the betrayal by Judas, the denials of Peter, the exit strategies being worked on by all the disciples, the forthcoming passion and death of Jesus. Everything looks bleak. It feels like failure. But into that bleakness the Lord takes bread 'this is my body', and wine 'this in my blood'. He presents those around him with himself, his lifeblood as a gift.

During the pandemic it seems to me that we have tried to do that. Faced with uncertainty, with the possibility of catching COVID even from those we love, in amongst all the restrictions on our daily lives, we have held onto our Lord as he gives himself to us in the Mass, and we have been given hope as his gift.

The Eucharistic life of our Church and our parish are offered to you day by day as a gift. It is a gift that challenges the way the world thinks and acts because it is the gift of life, not the possession of things. The One who was sold for thirty pieces of silver, gives us his flesh and blood. Gifts can be, and are, offered, but they must also be received. There is a chance everyday of each week for you to receive this gift. At the heart of the sacramental imagination is this notion of gift. We receive the gift of the Lord's body and blood so that we ourselves might become gifts to others.

If St John's has 7 members (not including Father Brendan) we can form a Walsingham Cell, a way of strengthening the ties with the Shrine within the worshipping community of St Johns.

Covid-19 Restrictions

(Updated 17th May)

Please be reminded the following applies to our worship in church so we can remain open.

- If you have symptoms please stay at home and worship with us on-line (all our services are Livestreamed).
- Masks must be worn (if you cannot wear a mask please consider a visor)
- Please use the hand sanitizer provided on entering the church and when reading at the lectern
- Please provide your contact details for Track and Trace or use the QR code
- Please follow the one-way system using the direction arrows on the aisles
- The government and Church of England Guidelines prevent any socialising in church apart from within your own households or bubbles, otherwise the two-metre 'rule' applies for communal worship.
- Please refrain from speaking to anyone before the service.
- Once seated please remain in your seat.
- At the end of the service please leave via the South Door.
- <u>Please refrain from entering the Vestry</u>, this is for Clergy and Servers only.
- Keep the South doorway clear for others to exit and do not re-enter the church once left.
- Please be reminded the rule of 30 applies outside the church.
