Words from Fr Brendan Clover

Dear friends,

It was good to meet with a rejuvenated PCC yesterday (Wednesday 11th May) and I'm delighted to be able to let you know that amongst other things the PCC accepted the Fabric Committee's recommendation that Aztec Building be appointed to carry out works on the lower hall and kitchen.

As I am writing this on Thursday morning I do not have start dates, but an earlier conversation with Aztec suggested that external works could begin very soon, with work on the kitchen beginning September at the latest. The specification includes the making good of the stairwells as well as the total renovation of the lower hall and kitchen. This is very welcome and suggests that within a few months we can get to work using the halls to enrich church life and as a focus for our engagement with the community.

Clevedon Library is one of four libraries in the South West to be awarded a grant for building improvements using funds from the DCMS, administered by Arts Council England. During the refurbishment the Library will be using the Upper Hall for events, especially with young families, a sign of a possible partnership to come.

80th Bishop of Bath and Wells announced



Downing Street has announced today (10am, 28 April 2022) that the Rt Revd Michael Beasley will be the next Bishop of Bath and Wells. He is currently the Bishop of Hertford, a role which he has held since 2015.

Prior to taking a fulltime role with the church, Bishop Michael was an epidemiologist, a background he was called on to use during the pandemic as a member of the Church of England's Covid task force.

Bishop Michael is already familiar with Somerset. His wife Lizzie is from a farming family from Somerset and prior to Bishop Michael being interviewed for the role of Bishop of Bath and Wells, they both undertook a 60 mile walk around the county.


Speaking in advance of today's announcement, Bishop Michael shared his joy in becoming the 80th Bishop of Bath and Wells and said he was looking forward to getting to know the people of Somerset.
