

Words from Fr Brendan Clover

Dear friends,

I am delighted to inform you that the celebrant and preacher on Sunday is Bishop Michael Langrish, former Diocesan Bishop of Exeter. Some of you may have met him at my Institution, which he kindly attended. Bishop Michael, who lives in retirement in Taunton, helps me out at All Saints Weston-super-Mare, but this is his first visit to us at St John's. He is an Assistant Bishop in the Diocese, and I was pleased to be at the cathedral on St Andrew's Day last year when this was officially celebrated.

A reminder that the Chrism Mass takes place at Gloucester Cathedral on Thursday 21st March at 11am. Mass is followed by a celebration lunch, some teaching and Benediction at 3pm. I hope that many of you will consider attending.

In the imminence of his Passion Jesus declared: 'Unless a grain of wheat falls on the ground and dies, it remains alone; but if it dies it yields a rich harvest.' Now the time approaches for which the Son of God came into the world, and, although his soul is troubled, he makes himself available to fulfil the Father's will to the end.

We need to make time to attend to this offering of the Son in Holy Week. Remember the three services which are part of the Triduum and really one service. Try and be there. Walk the Way of the Cross so that you can experience the full joy of Easter.

Art Installation

Our mystery artist writes:

A large wooden cross now hangs from the chains. Although shrouded by the cloth you can clearly see its shape through it.

The cloth and cross have now become the blood tipped point of a spear. It points to the empty chalice. The point of the spear that pierced Christ's flesh. The point of the nails that pierced his hands and feet. The point of the thorns that pierced his brow. Each piercing wound drew blood. The blood that he shed for us.

The whole point of the art piece was to link up the act of Christ's crucifixion with the act of taking communion, that we remember, not only Jesus as a person, but that we remember his sacrifice on the cross. A beautiful perfect soul living in a man's body was subjected to a violent and vicious torture and death, and his only crime was that he loved everyone, including those who condemned him.

On Easter Sunday the piece will finally be finished. The spear pointing towards the chalice is a huge clue as to what it will look like. It makes a very powerful statement. Can you guess what it might be?



Wells Cathedral Parish Pass

You may have seen in the news last week, that Wells Cathedral has announced changes to its admission guidelines with free passes for parishioners in the Diocese of Bath and Wells and local people, and a new entry charge for tourists.

Entry remains free to enter for worship, prayer, and to light a candle and free passes are available for parishioners in the diocese. Information about the Parish Pass and how to apply for it is available from the Wells passes section of the Wells Cathedral website. You will note that the application form for a Parish Pass does require a signature from a churchwarden or incumbent.


St John's 100 Club

The 100 club is an easy way you can help raise money for St. Johns. It only costs £12 per year (equivalent to £1 / month) and you will be entered into a drawer every month with a chance to win a prize. Over the last 15 years the 100 club, has raised over £12,000 for the church and has paid out almost £8,000 in prizes. Providing we have more than 80* people join we will pay out £40 in prizes each month and any profit over £510 will be paid to the Church but there is no upper limit, the more the merrier and the more money that will be raised for the church.

The three prizes are:

- 2 nd Prize £10
- 3 rd Prize £5
