Words from Fr Brendan Clover

Dear fellow pilgrim,

This is intended primarily for those of us who are going to Walsingham, but I thought it might encourage us all to think about doing such a thing...

I find two words really helpful when thinking about pilgrimage. A pilgrimage is an 'intentional journey'. Of course, life is an intentional journey because we believe it has meaning and purpose. Christians believe that life is a journey towards the God who created and redeemed us, and the climax of that journey is to reflect back to God that wonder and beauty and love He is in Himself, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, for all eternity. Wesley writes that we shall be 'Changed from glory into glory, till in heav'n we take our place, till we cast our crowns before thee lost in wonder, love and praise'. That's a fantastic description of our ultimate destiny. And notice how positive it is: we are already wearing the crowns! Most of our journeys take us to places we need to be for work or relaxation, holiday, family or friends. The joy is in arriving. But our pilgrimage begins the moment we set out - the journeys there and back are as much part of the experience as the arrival. Anyone who has walked the Camino to Santiago de Compostela will tell you of their experiences on the way, of the opportunities for service, of the chance encounter... It is no accident that the first Christians were called the followers of the Way. To emphasise this a pilgrimage might begin in your local church with a Little Office including the Benedictus, the sprinkling with holy water (a reminder of baptism), and a blessing for the journey. You might like to read the Benedictus - which speaks of God's journey towards us - before you set out to Walsingham:

Blessed be the Lord, the God of Israel; He has come to His people and set them free. He has raised up for us a mighty Saviour, Born of the house of His servant David. Through His holy prophets He promised of old That He would save us from our enemies, From the hands of all who hate us. He promised to show mercy to our fathers and to remember His holy Covenant. This was the oath He swore to our father Abraham: To set us free from the hands of our enemies, Free to worship Him without fear, Holy and righteous in His sight All the days of our life. You, my child shall be called the prophet of the Most High, for you will go before the Lord to prepare His way, to give his people knowledge of salvation by the forgiveness of their sins. In the tender compassion of our Lord The dawn from on high shall break upon us, to shine on those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death, and to guide our feet into the way of peace. Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit. As it was in the beginning is now, and will be forever. Amen.

Oftentimes pilgrims will set out on their journey with a specific intention either for themselves or others. That might be asking God for the resolution of a situation or personal difficulty, or for help in making a life changing decision. You might set out asking for God's healing, compassion and hope, for yourself or a loved one. You might set out asking for forgiveness for sins committed. There is always the opportunity at the destination to receive the laying on of hands and anointing for yourself or for another, to make your confession, and at Walsingham you may drink water from the Holy Well. And of course, we will be caught up in the worship of Him who is the Way, the Truth and the Life. He will make himself known to us in the Scriptures and in the Breaking of the Bread.

And that's the real point. To set out on the intentional journey which is a pilgrimage is to seek to be drawn deeper into our relationship with the living Christ, Mary's Son, God's Son, and to rejoice with her whom every generation calls blessed, Our Lady of Walsingham.

So let's have an intentional journey. Let part of our intention be to pray for the work of our Parish, for one another, for the mission of the Church and for everyone in need. And let's have fun and companionship along the Way!
