

Words from Fr Brendan Clover

Dear friends,

Bear with me as each week I repeat this introduction... There is a poem by Rowan Williams and it is called 'Advent Calendar'. It is a haunting piece: austere, deep, searching, suffused with wintry aches and longings we recognise as peculiar to this season. The language is as spare as naked trees, tough as hardened earth. It is intended to make us shiver. Its dense texture needs patience to grasp its complexity; its flinty Anglo-Saxon words are unsoftened by soothing Latin or French cadences.

The four stanzas each elaborate a different simile: 'he will come like' the fall of the leaf, like winter's frost, like darkness following a late afternoon flash of sunlight, like the cry of night-time. It stands in a long tradition of northern Europe poetry in which the cold short days around the winter solstice echo our wintry spirits when our light burns low.

The point about imagery is that we shouldn't explain it, for that would be to explain it away, reduce poetry to prose.

Here's the third stanza:

He will come like dark. One evening when the bursting red December sun draws up the sheet And penny-masks its eye to yield The star-snowed fields of sky.

Week three takes us on towards the solstice and its 'bursting red December sun'. I imagine this as one of those days when slate-hued clouds hang low over the earth and leach all the colour from a fervourless landscape ('as fervour-less as I' says Thomas Hardy in another famous wintry poem 'The Darkling Thrush'). Then just as the light begins to fail, there is a clearing in the west and a flash of glory reveals a setting sun. Too soon it sinks below the horizon, and it is dark and clear and cold and the 'star-snowed fields of sky' appear.

So this is not the radiant sun that late in time rises with healing in its wings to warm the land and coax it back to life. No, this is the solstice, John Donne's weak winter sun whose strength is spent at the year's midnight. That phrase 'star-snowed fields' keeps us well and truly shivering.

So, the sun's brief splendour heralds night not day. And he will come, says the poem, not like the sun but 'like the dark' that follows its all-too-brief epiphany.

I think that like the first two stanzas, the poet wants us to read the daytime of our life in the light of its ending: just as the leaves fall and the land freezes over, day turns to night and reminds us of the night into which we must all go. And like the wind and the frost, the night brings its own truth to bear upon our condition. What we are at night, when we are so to speak naked only to God and ourselves, that is the truth of what we are. When this night falls, the poet does not lead us indoors to seek warmth and comfort, or even wrap the darkness round us to protect us. We are still outside in the cold, watching, waiting, wondering, longing, hoping against hope that in the dark there is a kindness and a mercy. This is Advent. This is life.

If you would like to take one of the Communion elements to the altar during the offertory hymn, please let one of the sidespeople know when you come into Church on Sunday morning.


Sick List

2024 Parish Share Request

As we have shared with you previously, parish share receipts in our diocese have fallen significantly in recent years making it difficult to cover the cost of paid ministry and the associated support costs for parishes, school and chaplaincies. We are very aware that our request to help address that shortfall comes as we are trying to reach deeper into our communities and grow our church families, against a backdrop of a cost-of-living crisis, a fall in the number of volunteers, and the increased cost of maintaining our beautiful buildings.

Based on the parish share currently paid, only 20% of benefices cover the cost of paid ministry and support in their benefice, with the remaining 80% of benefices having their paid ministry and support subsidised through the Common Fund. This is not a sustainable financial position. If we want to maintain our ministry provision across our diocese we need to find ways to address this imbalance together.

A breakdown and explanation of your request is attached and reflects the need, as identified by the Finance Group, to increase parish share broadly in line with inflation. Bishop's Council are therefore recommending an increase of parish share by 10% for 2024. This recommendation will go to Diocesan Synod, on 25 November 2023 for approval. For parishes who pay monthly or in advance, discounts are applicable:

- 1.25% for full contribution received on or before 17 January
- 0.3% for full equal monthly contributions

Bishop's Council is also recommending a system of floors and ceilings to both minimise excessive changes to requests of parishes from 2023 to 2024 and to address the 20%/80% issue identified above. Further details are included in the accompanying breakdown.

Parish Share allocation considerations

Since January 2022, the Consumer Price index (CPI) has exceeded 5%, peaking at 11.1% in October 2022, which is causing significant financial pressures for us all. It means costs are inflating and any increase to parish share requests below CPI would in fact mean a cut in income to the Common Fund, which funds the costs associated with providing stipendiary ministry across Bath and Wells.

In recent years, stipends have increased at a greater rate than the parish share requests. In 2022, stipends increased by 2%, in 2023 by 5% and in 2024 it is anticipated that General Synod will again recommend an increase in stipend by 5%. In comparison, in 2022, there was no increase in our parish share request and in 2023 it was 2%.

Clevedon District Foodbank will be providing over 600 Christmas hamper bags to people and families this Christmas time.



St. John's 100 Club
