Words from Fr Brendan Clover

Dear friends,

We are off to a good start.

The Ash Wednesday Mass was lovely and thank you to those of you who supported it by your presence.

Our Lent course - How to pray better - led by Canon Nicola Stanley begins this Sunday at 5.30pm and it ends with Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament at 6.15pm. 'Would you not watch with me one hour?'

And it seems there are enough people interested in a Bible Study group. So this will meet on Tuesdays at 6pm - 7pm in the James Room in the Elton Hall. No need to bring anything as we will provide the text to be prayed over and discussed.

Stations of the Cross will take place after the 6pm Mass on Wednesdays.

And here is something from our art installation person:

Material.....Things have changed. The chains now hold what looks like a bundled up piece of cloth. Surely the chains are far too big for such a lightweight piece of cloth. Maybe there is something heavy inside it?

Upon the tiny altar is a small old wooden bowl. It is filled with ash. What does this mean? Why is ash used to begin Lent? Ash was never a part of the Easter story, so why is it being used now? What is the connection between the bundled up cloth and the bowl of ash ? Is there any? As we move further into Lent more clues will slowly appear. Have you any idea what the finished piece will look like? Have a happy and holy Lent, Fr Brendan






