Words from Fr Brendan Clover

Dear friends,

This Sunday's Gospel reading picks up on the events of the first Easter Day. The two disciples have returned from Emmaus confident that they had seen the Lord. 'Were not our hearts burning within us while he was talking to us on the road?' St John Henry Newman chose "Heart speaks unto Heart" as the motto to go on his coat of arms when he became a Cardinal in 1879. Inspired by these words spoken by St. Francis de Sales, Newman calls us to hear God speaking to our hearts and to listen for our mission from God. This must be our first priority... to attend to God and to the things of God, to his word and his sacraments, to find our hearts in tune with the heart of God.

From this comes our purpose: to love God and our neighbour as ourselves. We have many ways in which we can do this. I have an aspiration that St John's becomes a beacon of Catholic life in the Church of England not just in Clevedon, but in the South West...

And then there is our mission, to seek out the poor and the underdog, the vulnerable and the marginalized. We have fabulous resources: a significant Victorian church with a perfect acoustic; two church halls; wonderful grounds. How do we place these things as a resource for the community, without of course neglecting our necessary revenue streams? That's a debate we need to begin to enter into. Thank you so much for the warmth of your greetings as I have moved into the Vicarage, and as I was licensed as your parish priest. Let us pray for one another daily. Yours ever,

The first Monday Mass of each month will be a Requiem Mass, with a chance to invite families of those bereaved.

Donation

A donation of £210 has been sent to Christian Aid to help fund vaccinations against Covid-19 in many of the poorer countries of the world.

The money was raised by donations from generous parishioners in both Clevedon and Kenn who gave the money in lieu of cash which would normally have been raised by the annual Lent Lunches in Celia and John's home in Kenn which did not go ahead this year because of the pandemic.

Some of the money was gift aided so the total value of the donation was £237.50.

Covid-19 Restrictions

Please be reminded the following applies to our worship in church so we can remain open.

- If you have symptoms please stay at home and worship with us on-line (all our services are Livestreamed).
- Masks must be worn (if you cannot wear a mask please consider a visor)
- Please use the hand sanitizer provided on entering the church and when reading at the lectern
- Please provide your contact details for Track and Trace or use the QR code
- Please follow the one-way system using the direction arrows on the aisles
- The government and Church of England Guidelines prevent any socialising in church apart from within your own households or bubbles.
- Please refrain from speaking to anyone before the service.
- Once seated please remain in your seat.
- At the end of the service please leave via the North Door.
- Please refrain from entering the Vestry, this is for Clergy and Servers only.
- Keep the North doorway clear for others to exit and do not re-enter the church once left.
- Please be reminded the rule of 6 applies outside the church.

At the beginning of Lent Fr. Brendan challenged us all to endeavour to attend at least one extra daily Mass and it was great to see so many folk respond to that request.

When we received last week's newsletter we were excited to see that Fr. Brendan and others will be celebrating Mass and saying morning and evening prayer in church most days. With more gaps than dates in our diaries still, we have decided to try to set ourselves a weekly routine of attending some of the services available. It won't be the same days each week but we will try to keep to our commitment.

As lockdown eases and "normal" things creep back into our lives, we shall feel extremely grateful that we have lived through the bad times, we have had our vaccinations, and a legacy of daily masses has enabled us to stay grounded in all that is important in our spiritual life at St. John's.

Wellspring Counselling Service continues to offer vital support

Wellspring Counselling has been caring for people across North Somerset since 1994. The service provides affordable, professional counselling for adults as well as donation-based counselling for young people aged 11 to 18.

Wellspring has counsellors available to help adults with a wide range of concerns, including anxiety, depression, relationship issues, abuse and bereavement. All counsellors are professionally trained, have regular clinical supervision and engage in Continued Professional Development.

Since the pandemic hit and the country first went into lockdown in March, Wellspring has adapted its services and is currently working with clients remotely, offering the option of video calls or telephone sessions during the day or evening. The continuation of this much-needed service has been a lifeline for many who have been struggling with their mental health in these difficult and unprecedented times.
