### **Words from Fr Brendan Clover**

Dear friends,

As you know Mothering Sunday is about Mother Church, and Mary, mother of the Lord. As a consequence of our love for Mother Church, and Mary, mother of the Lord, we honour our own mothers and give thanks for them.

Nick Fawcett, a modern preacher and poet has written the following:

### Meditation of Mary, mother of Jesus

What was that Simeon said – 'A sword will pierce your soul'?

I spent so long wondering what that meant, tossing and turning on my bed, brooding and fretting when I'd a moment to myself.

It seemed such a strange thing to say, especially at what was meant to be a time of joy.

We'd only had Jesus a few days, and my heart was still bursting with happiness.

We were over the moon, Simeon too, that's the odd thing – he was almost dancing with delight. But then his expression clouded, and he gave that awful warning which has haunted me ever since. I just haven't been able to forget it, try as I might. Always the question has been there, nagging away at the back of my mind, even in the brightest moments: what did he mean?

And if you'd asked me as little as a week ago,I still wouldn't have been sure.

Oh, I'd a fair idea by then, of course – the fears were mounting up – but I'd still kept on hoping, praying that I might be wrong.

Now I know though, all too well.

My heart is not just pierced – it's broken! For I've stood here today and seen my son die. I watched him cursed and ridiculed, scourged and beaten.

I watched as they hammered nails through his hands and lifted him onto a cross.

I watched in agony and cried out in despair.

And a moment ago I watched as they plunged a spear into his side.

At least he didn't feel that – thank God he was dead by then – but I did. It thrust deep inside, running me through without mercy.

I've never known such pain, such agony, such horror.

And now life has gone for me too; I feel it has nothing left to offer.

Yet he's given me joy, no one can take that away.

He was with me for thirty wonderful years, everything a son could be – not many mothers can say that.

I've had joy, and now I have pain. Maybe that's the way it had to be, the way it has to be, if there's to be any joy at all.

### **CHRISM MASS**



### CONGREGATIONAL LENTEN DISCIPLINE

The Worship Committee want to suggest that we try to make that our Congregational Lenten Discipline this year to seek to recover the calm before the most important duty we can perform as Christians, our attending the Lord's Supper on the Lord's Day.

So, we suggest that you might like to come earlier to church so that you can hear the glorious bellringing and say your hellos. The notices will be given at 10.25am sharp, and then silence descends until the Sacristy bell rings. That way, please God, we may be more prepared for all that is to follow.

### AN IMPORTANT NOTICE FROM FR BRENDAN

Dear friends,

A decision was made by the PCC at an Extraordinary Meeting on 27<sup>th</sup> February which will have farreaching effects on us all. In saying this, I am not being overdramatic, but merely stating facts. That decision was ultimately to seek the union of this parish with that of All Saints and St Saviour's, Weston super Mare. As a precursor to this I am to be licensed there as Interim Minister at St Saviour's Church Hall on Wednesday 29<sup>th</sup> March at 11am.

Let me explain what lies behind this.

The diocese is facing a significant shortfall due in part to the effects of COVID. This Deanery is being asked to cut three full time clergy posts. As part of the Diocese's savings' plan, the criteria for parishes to warrant a single priest has been changed, both in terms of Common Fund paid, and church membership. Unless a parish pays at least £50k into the Common Fund each year they will not receive a full-time priest.

In both financial and membership terms, St John's does not warrant, and with the modest growth we have seen, a full-time priest. Since I arrived in April 2021 this parish has been subsidized by the Diocese to the tune of tens of thousands of pounds. I am anxious that we are not caught in an invidious and vulnerable position, and at the mercy of those all around. I have no doubt that unless we seize the initiative, then St John's, as a Society parish with its beautiful liturgy and Catholic practice, will be severely compromised by an inevitable union with a neighboring parish, (though which one is hard to see!).

As I have said before the only way out of the current crisis is to grow and to adapt to changing circumstances.

Increasingly, across the country parishes such as ours are joining with others with shared outlook and beliefs, in what are called 'Affinity' parishes. These are parishes which do not share a physical boundary but share the same position within the Church of England. The Diocese has asked me to take on All Saints and St Saviour's in Weston super Mare and will license me there, as here, up until April next year, 2024. If we can make the new situation work, and if both parishes see growth, then there is a chance my time among you may be extended. I very much want that to happen. What I intend is that over the next year, we share me, as parish priest, increasingly more. There will continue to be a weekday Mass, but it will be across the two parishes. I will, as best as I can, alternate presiding and preaching here and there, Sunday by Sunday. I will be heavily dependent on my retired colleagues here and there. There will be no formal, legal union in the next year, but rather it is a period in which we can see how things may work, and if they do work. If this is successful, then the remaining time of my ministry here - if I am granted it - will be spent in bedding things down more permanently, so that when I do eventually retire, there will be a viable, and attractive, full-time post for a successor.

I am not unaware of the additional pressure this will put me under as an individual, nor the effect on you as members of the congregation. However, I have been perfectly clear and brutally honest about the future from day one. We are in a very weak position to negotiate. Things are changing and changing fast. In taking this decision, the PCC are seizing control of events, rather than being victims of them. This is a very significant time in our life together. I do urge you to hold this parish, its officers and PCC in your prayers, recognizing that we cannot cling to the past. The Christian life is one of continual movement, onwards and upwards. And please do pray for the people of All Saints and St Saviour's, who have been without a parish priest for some time, and pray for me.



### Do you have talents and experience to share?

After many years of loyal and dedicated service to this parish and the PCC, with much sadness we are saying farewell to our PCC Secretary, Sue and our Treasurer, Fiona at the Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM) in April. Sue and Fiona have done a fabulous job at keeping the PCC on track procedurally and financially. We thank them so much for all they have done for St John's Church.

We are now in search of replacements for Sue and Fiona, who are difficult acts to follow. However, both these roles are supported by the diocese who run an induction programme, regular updates, access to the diocese Finance Department and the Diocesan Secretary's office, plus buddies in similar roles in other parishes, and the support of the Churchwardens, PCC Chair and relevant sub-committees at St John's.

We hope the following provides a brief insight into the roles we are looking to fill:

### **PCC Secretary**

The primary responsibilities of a PCC Secretary are to support the PCC Chair in the preparation and organisation of meetings and to handle all correspondence on behalf of the PCC. The Diocesan Office contacts the parish from time to time to request specific information, every effort is made to keep this to a minimum and all meeting agendas are issued and minutes stored electronically using Microsoft Office.

### **PCC Treasurer**

You do not need to have been a treasurer of an organisation before. In many respects it is not to dissimilar from keeping good control of household finances, however, if you have an understanding of some accountancy practice it will be useful but not essential. This role implements decisions made the PCC. This role is also supported with dioceses induction training for new treasurers, updates and continued support throughout the financial year for all financial procedures and processes .
