Words from Fr Brendan Clover

Dear friends,

As I write this on Thursday it has been a perfect day for the launch of the Arts Festival in church. We have had many visitors, the oldest of those I met being 102! One care home has sent all its residents and for many of them their journey to St John's has been their first trip out since the pandemic began. For these reasons alone this partnership with the Clevedon Art Club has been positive and is bringing benefits. I hope that you will be able to come and see the exhibition.

Because of the disruption in the church, I propose that coffee after Mass on Sunday is served at the Vicarage.

Those who came to Mass today had the privilege of Mass at the High Altar with the congregation seated in the High Altar sanctuary. This is where we say the Office when we are few in number, but it would be good to include this space in our regular round of weekday worship more fully. <u>Preparation for the COP26 Climate Change conference</u>

We would like to invite you to the Clevedon Quaker Meeting House on Saturday, 25th September at 11.30 am. Over refreshments and looking at our display board, we would like to share concerns for the climate crisis and awareness of the importance of the forthcoming COP26 conference in Glasgow in November.

'The produce of the earth is a gift from our gracious creator to the inhabitants, and to impoverish the earth now to support outward greatness appears to be an injury to the succeeding age' (John Woolman, Quaker, 1772)

Quakers have a long established concern for Sustainability and Climate Justice. In order to raise awareness of COP26, some Quaker Meetings have started a chain of pilgrimage across their areas towards Glasgow, with each Meeting walking or cycling to the next. On the 25th September, some of us from Clevedon Meeting will be walking to Portishead Quaker Meeting after our meeting with you and our other guests from the Clevedon community.

As you are aware, the COP26 conference is the most crucial one since the Paris Agreement failed to live up to its promises. The latest IPCC report issued a 'red alert' for the planet and we all know that time is short. The world's population is increasingly waking up to the potentially catastrophic effect of the climate disaster. For many people in the world this catastrophe is already happening, and we need governments to take bold action of leadership to ensure that the increase in global temperature is kept within 1.5 degrees and to achieve net zero carbon by 2030. We want our government to know that we are walking to show our readiness for change and to demand investment in Climate Justice. We are aware that faith communities and our local churches in Clevedon have these issues much in mind. The Young Christian Climate Network has led the way and have asked us to join them in prayer and action to amplify the message. We hope you can join us so we can share ideas about what our local churches can do. Please let us know if you are able to come.
