### **Words from Fr Brendan Clover**

Dear friends,

This Sunday we welcome Bishop Mike Hill, formerly Bishop of Bristol, as our preacher. In the evening we have a service of Readings and Carols. The clock is ticking down to Christmas.

The celebration of Christ's incarnation at Christmas is one of the two poles of the Christian year. The wonderful mystery of God's dwelling among us in the fullness of humanity, as Emmanuel, foretold by the prophets and born of Mary, provides the material of the feast:

Hark, hark, the wise eternal word,

like a weak infant cries!

In form of servant is the Lord.

and God in cradle lies.

(Thomas Pestel)

Christmas is much more then than simply the celebration of Jesus' birth, and neither of the great Christmas morning readings (Hebrews 1 and John 1) is taken from the infancy narratives. The task of the Christmas liturgy is to recall us, amid all the joyful customs and celebrations of Christmas, to this central truth of the Word made flesh for our salvation.

It is, of course, Christ's nativity that has provided the occasion for this festival of the incarnation, since the end of the third century when the Christian Church reinterpreted the Mithraic festival of *Natalis Sulis*, the Birthday of the Sun, as the occasion of the Saviour's birth. The Christmas crib and the nativity play can both be said to descend from the tableau of Christ's birth that Francis of Assisi arranged when he celebrated Christmas at Greccio in 1223. Christmas carols are a medieval tradition, which has been notably developed from the end of the nineteenth century. The Festival of Lessons and Carols is itself an influential English creation of the late nineteenth century, made widespread by the choir of King's College, Cambridge, in the first half of the twentieth.

The Christmas season is celebrated for twelve days, ending with the Epiphany. And it is full of Festivals: Stephen, the first Martyr; our own St John the Evangelist; the Holy Innocents; Thomas Becket; the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God. There are many opportunities to immerse ourselves in these celebrations as Mass is offered every day.

May God grant you a happy and holy Christmas,

### The Clergy's Recommendations for Advent Reading

### Fr Brendan

My recommended Advent reading is John by Niall Williams.

'What invisible drama plays, what passes to and fro in the columns of air above them, none knows, but the disciples think: perhaps the time is arrived at last.

Aged, blind and perilously frail, John the Apostle has walked ten thousand miles to tell of love. In a hundred years he has lived to witness sights and scenes that now cloud his mind. Of his followers, there are few remaining, banished with him to an island where they wait as storm clouds whip the island with rain. They wait for the world to free them from exile. They wait for signs that seem like they will never come.

But eventually a sign does come and together the disciples leave the island. They embark on a journey that will change their lives forever: a journey filled with purpose and fear which will test their belief - in love and in each other - to breaking point, and John must face his biggest battle yet.

### **Prebendary John**

I would recommend To Be a Pilgrim by Basil Hume. It is an old book (1984 though it has been reissued since then) but still very relevant to anyone who seeks to follow Christ. Hume explores spirituality is a series of short thoughts, the sort of work you can dip in to and it is a great encouragement answering many of the questions any of us might face. It is an easy read.

It is published by St Paul Publications. ISBN 085439 231 9. It is available on Amazon price £9.99. If anyone thinks they might like to read it but cannot get hold of it they would be welcome to borrow my copy.

### Fr Robert

I'd suggest something like Tom Wright's 'Luke (or Matthew) For Everyone'. It is not academic, is easy to read and be bought for about £10 from Amazon.

### **Important Public Notice**

### Statutory School Admissions Arrangement Consultation Proposals to Alter The Admission Arrangements Applying For St John the Evangelist Church School

### The Consultation:

In accordance with the requirements of the 2021 School Admissions Code, the Bath and Wells Multi Academy Trust is proposing to remove the designated catchment area for St John the Evangelist Church School which is currently used to prioritise admission applications in the event of oversubscription (Criterion 3).

This proposal is subject to public school admission arrangements consultation according to the timeframe and arrangements set out below. It is proposed that the catchment area will be officially removed on 1 September 2023.

The reason for removing the catchment area is to generally improve the level of fairness for all children. It will no longer be the case that admission applications for children living within a defined catchment line on a map will be prioritised over those applications for children who live more locally when measured by straight line distance. Proximity of the home address to school will determine the application priority whereby those living closest to the school by straight line measurement will be given the higher priority. This also helps to support the principle of a wider school choice for parents and children.

### What happens next?

Following closure of the consultation, the Admission Authority will meet to consider any comments returned during the consultation period. Within eight calendar weeks of the consultation ending, a response will be published on the school website and consultees will be informed of this.

Once agreed in final form the Admission Authority will publish the 2023/24 Admission Arrangements on the school website by 15th March **2022.**
