# **Words from Fr Brendan Clover**

Dear friends,

In the year 390, Ambrose, Bishop of Milan, sent a letter to one of his parishioners. Ambrose was convinced that this parishioner had committed a grievous and public sin. In his letter, Ambrose told the parishioner that until he repented publicly he would not be allowed to receive Communion. Ambrose had excommunicated him. But this was no ordinary church member. It was Theodosius, emperor of the Roman Empire. It seems one of Theodosius' officials had been murdered in the Greek city of Thessalonica.

The exact circumstances are unclear. Perhaps it was a tax revolt. Perhaps it was a random terrorist attack. In any event, Theodosius had done what emperors always do. He sent in the army to teach the people of Thessalonica, and by extension the rest of the empire, a lesson. Some 7,000 people - men, women, and children - were killed, the vast majority of whom had had nothing to do with the death of the official. Ambrose was not a pacifist, but he knew that the emperor's actions needed to be condemned even if it meant the very real possibility of being sent to prison or killed. Emperors don't usually like to be challenged. Against all odds, Emperor Theodosius repented and publicly sought absolution from his bishop.

I've been thinking a lot about Ambrose and Theodosius lately. What would Ambrose say about the invasion of Ukraine? Religious leaders around the world, including our bishops, have stated that this war is an act of evil aggression. And it is. There is today no avoiding the hard fact that, whether we commit to the nonviolence of Jesus or to the 'judicious' use of violence, we are all stretched out between the catastrophe we have made of the

world, and the promise of God's good creation and

his kingdom.

And if we read the Ten Commandments afresh it is clear that God is asking something extraordinary from his people – to throw away all their other comforts and securities, and to rely on him alone; to forget all the normal rules of power and dominance, and build a society that will reflect God's strange preference for the poor and the powerless.

In these dark days that remains a challenge. But it remains the challenge of this holy season. Can we rise to it? Ever,

# RECOMMENDED LENT READING

# **Entering the Twofold Mystery** by Eric Varden

Erik Varden became Bishop of Trondheim in his native Norway on 2019. This, his second book, is a meditation on the religious life, on the life of Christ, and the call to live in community.

The Archbishop of Canterbury's Lent Book this year is

**Embracing Justice** by Isabelle Hamley. Isabelle is the Archbishop's former chaplain, now theological adviser to the House of Bishops. Her knowledge as an Old Testament scholar shines forth in the first three chapters on Genesis, Exodus and liberation. The remaining chapters deal with the Incarnation, the Crucifixion and Holy Communion.

in **The Way of the Franciscans - A Prayer Journey through Lent** Daniel Horan offers insights from Franciscans across the ages. There are questions for reflection or discussion.

Richard Harries, former Bishop of Oxford, offers us **Hearing God in poetry** - **Fifty poems for Lent and Easter.** Each chapter is a poem and a short reflection on the poet, poem and some gentle theology. Henry Martin is a retired prison chaplain retired to France where he devotes his time to writing, painting, his husband and their dog. **Vincent van Gogh and the Good Samaritan** recalls Henri Nouwen's classic on the prodigal son.

# **Electoral Roll**

The revision of this year's Electoral Roll will begin from this Sunday and end on Sunday 3<sup>rd</sup> April when the new Roll will be published.

Apart from it being necessary to be on the Roll of the Parish in order to vote at the APCM, it is an opportunity to demonstrate in a tangible way commitment to the Parish and its mission. To be entered onto the Roll you must be Baptised and over the age of 16. You do not have to reside in the Parish if you have attended worship at the Parish Church habitually over the past 6 months (I fall into this category ) or have been prevented from doing so due to illness, work commitments etc. You may also be on the Electoral Roll of more than one Parish but can only serve as a Church Officer (Warden, Treasurer, PCC member etc.) in one. I will explain on Sunday morning, if you can wait that long, how you can apply to be entered onto the Roll and will also display a name only roll at the back of the Church to see if you are already on it. If you are, you need do nothing for another couple of years when the Roll will then be created again.





# **OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD**

We have received the following report on the shoeboxes we sent at Christmas.

Thank you for bringing joy to a child living in Central Asia! Your shoebox gift was one of 65,668 sent from the UK to a country in Central Asia. Your shoebox gift is helping to show the love of Christ, planting seeds and building goodwill between communities of all faiths and none. However, while political and religious sensitivities continue within Central Asia and for the safety of our ministry partners living in restricted areas, they have asked us not to disclose details about the specific country your shoebox was sent to. Please know that even though we are not able to disclose exactly where your shoebox gift went, we are confident that it will bring great joy and hope to the precious child receiving it, both now and for many years to come.

In the South Bristol area, we processed a wonderful 13,206 boxes. The UK sent 277,350 shoeboxes in total. Globally we sent 10.6 million gift filled boxes of love to children all around the world. We are grateful for all the donations received, either actual boxes, gifts to help top up those which needed it, or money to help with transport. We want to thank God for all that help received and will be holding a Thank You Service at **Christ the Servant Church** in **Stockwood** on **Saturday 26th March** at **2.00 pm.** We would love to see you there to share in our gratitude and celebrate the wonderful work which God has helped us to achieve.
