

Words from the Archdeacon to our Wardens and PCC.

Dear Ray, Gary and Nicola

I trust you are all well. As I'm sure you are aware, there has been a process of deanery planning going on in all the deaneries across the Diocese. That process is coming to a conclusion in Portishead and Locking Deanery. And so we are in a position to make some decisions about the future. I wanted to write and explain how this impacts both of your parishes.

The intention is to lift the suspension from St Johns Clevedon, and for Fr Brendan to become the permanent full-time incumbent. This is because there is to be no pastoral reorganization in Clevedon, at least for the foreseeable future. It also recognizes the great work Fr Brendan has done to revive ministry at St Johns. We will also ask Fr Brendan to continue as interim minister at All Saints Weston Super Mare for two years. This will give a good period of time for Fr Brendan to help grow the work at ASWSM, and to see how the partnership between ASWSW and SJC works. If this is seen to be a fruitful partnership after that interim period, we will move to making it a united benefice, and install Fr Brendan as incumbent of both parishes. It seems to be sensible to have a trial period, as it is an unusual step, not done in many places, and we need to check that having parishes geographically separated under one incumbent is workable. I trust that is acceptable to all, and if so, we will move forward with this as soon as possible.

It would be good if you could share this with your PCCs and I look forward to hearing from you. With prayerful best wishes Adrian



Bell Ringing for the Coronation!!



Sorry this is a bit after the event. However I thought you might be interested to know about the changes we rang over the Coronation weekend, both on the Saturday, before the Coronation, and before Sunday Service.

All the changes had a 'Royal' connection:

One you will be familiar with was 'Queens' with the bells rung in this order 1,3,5,2,4,6

then on to 'Kings' which is 5,3,1,2,4,6

followed by 'Orb' with the bells in this order 3,2,1,5,4,6

and before we went back into rounds we rang 'Sceptre' 2,1,4,3,6,5

We had 13 of our own ringers in the tower to 'Ring for the King' on the morning of the Coronation, but special mention must be made of our 4 learner ringers who rang on an open bell (they made a noise!) for the first time on this occasion: well done Poppy, Erin, Sam and Michelle.

All the ringers have been given a commemorative badge to mark the event.
