Words from Fr Brendan Clover

Dear friends,

It will be very good indeed to welcome Clevedon Choral Society back to St John's after a long gap. Their concert this Saturday evening contains Faure's Requiem and a collection of other sacred music. I hope many of you will want to be there. Things are, at last, getting back to normal. The mood of the readings at Mass has changed in recent days, especially the Gospel readings which are from the fifteenth and sixteenth chapters of John's Gospel. The church is looking forward to the Feast of the Ascension, next Thursday, and to Pentecost ten days later. These are significant feasts not to be missed!

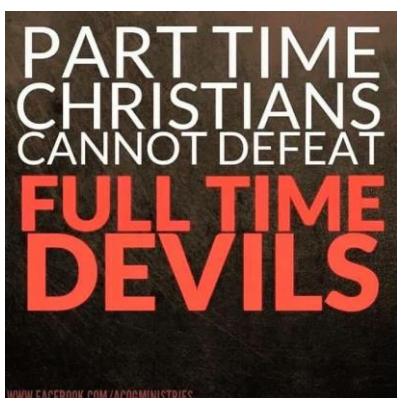
Last week the PCC voted to go ahead with works in the lower hall and kitchen, and the builders came this week to refresh their memory of the works needed. A scaffold will be erected in August to allow the removal of the blown render on the south wall. Once the wall has dried out new render will be applied. That wall then becomes water tight.

Works inside will begin in September and will take a maximum of eight weeks. So, with luck and God willing, everything will be completed by November. . We have been supported by grants from the following charities: Benefact Trust (£2250); Number One Trust (£15k); and Sabina Sutherland Trust (£5k). A further application for £20k is with the John Booth Charitable Foundation. Here's hoping!

The lettings of our Upper Hall will not be compromised by the works going on below though there may be some extraneous noise!

One last thing... Tony Wring's Memorial Service is to be held on Tuesday 5th July at 11.30am following a Requiem Mass at 10am. I'm sure many of you will want to be there.
