Words from Fr Brendan Clover

Dear friends at St John's,

Nicola, Nick and I met on Monday evening to talk about how we use our church now that the restrictions have been lifted.

What we propose now will be reviewed in September.

The 'Track and trace' procedure is no longer strictly necessary, but we think it prudent to keep a log of people attending for worship. We hope this is not off putting.

We have a 'temporary faculty' for the seating in church to remain as it is, and we intend leaving it as it is so that pews remain more than 2 metres apart. We encourage you to sit in your "bubbles". The 'One Way' directions will also remain, but the south door will be used for entry and recess. The North door reverts to its use as a disabled access.

We are going to sing! The recorded hymns we have been using over the past months (which are given to us each week by the Church of England free of copyright restrictions) will be played over the sound system as before and you are encouraged to join in. Please restrain from loud singing - it isn't a football match - it is the worship of Almighty God. Please join in the Entrance Hymn, the Recessional hymn and the Communion hymn. We will listen to an anthem at the Offertory as the altar is prepared and the gifts, and we, are honoured with incense.

Masks: we cannot enforce the wearing of masks, but we encourage it at the moment for the sake of the common good, not least with the cases of COVID locally on the rise.

Holy Communion: along with hymn singing we expect that the removal of the Common Cup has been a significant loss. From this Sunday a eucharistic minister will be at the North door with a charged and consecrated chalice. If you wish to, you may go to that chalice after the celebrant has given you the Host, dip the Host in the Precious Blood, and receive your Communion. No words will be said. Both the celebrant and the eucharistic minister will have the faces covered, as before.

We will continue sharing the Peace as before... without physical contact.

As I said we will review these changes in September, but we hope that what we propose goes some way towards recognising a changing situation, whilst being sensitive to the local situation and any anxieties you may have.

I hope to see many of you at Mass on Sunday, and don't forget... there are opportunities to come to church every day, and sometimes a quieter, more reflective service, can recharge our spiritual batteries.
