### **Words from Fr Brendan Clover**

Dear friends,

At a meeting of the Worship Committee this week we proposed a Congregational Lenten Discipline in respect of our Sunday Mass. It is always wonderful to be together, and the desire to speak to one another, to share good news and sadness, is almost overwhelming to the extent that our preparation for the Divine Liturgy is somewhat compromised.

In my title parish forty years ago, there was a sign on the Church door which could not be avoided. It said this:

Before Mass, talk to God During Mass, let God talk to you After Mass, talk to each other.

The Worship Committee want to suggest that we try to make that our Congregational Lenten Discipline this year to seek to recover the calm before the most important duty we can perform as Christians, our attending the Lord's Supper on the Lord's Day.

So, we suggest that you might like to come earlier to church so that you can hear the glorious bellringing and say your hellos. The notices will be given at 10.25am sharp, and then silence descends until the Sacristy bell rings. That way, please God, we may be more prepared for all that is to follow. And this Sunday we will be delighted to welcome as our preacher Fr Mark Smith who will be thrilled to sign your copy of his book.


May God grant us a happy and holy Lent.



# **COCONUT CAKE**

As requested, here is the recipe for the coconut cake served at last week's Celebration Sunday. It's taken from a book called 'Jane's Patisserie' by Jane Dunn.

For the Cake:	For the Buttercream:
175 g baking spread, or unsalted butter	200 g unsalted butter at room temperature
250 g caster sugar	400 g icing sugar
300 g self raising flour	50-75 ml coconut milk
1 tsp baking powder	For the decoration:
4 eggs	25 g coconut flakes or dessicated coconut
275 ml tinned coconut milk	
75 g dessicated coconut	

Line and grease 2 x 20 cm sandwich tins. Preheat the oven to 180°C/160° fan.

Beat butter and sugar together until light and fluffy. Add the SR flour, baking powder and eggs. Beat again until combined. Gradually add the coconut milk, mixing all the time, then fold through the coconut. Divide mixture between the two tins and bake for 30 - 35 minutes. Leave in the tins for 10 minutes then cool completely on a rack.

Beat the butter until it is smooth. Add the icing sugar in two batches, beating well after each addition. Add the coconut milk and beat until smooth and fluffy. Use to sandwich the two cakes together and to spread on the top.

Toast the coconut in a dry frying pan then sprinkle over the cake. Serve and enjoy!



# Do you have talents and experience to share?

After many years of loyal and dedicated service to this parish and the PCC, with much sadness we are saying farewell to our PCC Secretary, Sue and our Treasurer, Fiona at the Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM) in April. Sue and Fiona have done a fabulous job at keeping the PCC on track procedurally and financially. We thank them so much for all they have done for St John's Church.

We are now in search of replacements for Sue and Fiona, who are difficult acts to follow. However, both these roles are supported by the diocese who run an induction programme, regular updates, access to the diocese Finance Department and the Diocesan Secretary's office, plus buddies in similar roles in other parishes, and the support of the Churchwardens, PCC Chair and relevant sub-committees at St John's.

We hope the following provides a brief insight into the roles we are looking to fill:

#### **PCC Secretary**

The primary responsibilities of a PCC Secretary are to support the PCC Chair in the preparation and organisation of meetings and to handle all correspondence on behalf of the PCC. The Diocesan Office contacts the parish from time to time to request specific information, every effort is made to keep this to a minimum and all meeting agendas are issued and minutes stored electronically using Microsoft Office.

#### **PCC Treasurer**

You do not need to have been a treasurer of an organisation before. In many respects it is not to dissimilar from keeping good control of household finances, however, if you have an understanding of some accountancy practice it will be useful but not essential. This role implements decisions made the PCC. This role is also supported with dioceses induction training for new treasurers, updates and continued support throughout the financial year for all financial procedures and processes.
