Words from Fr Brendan Clover

Dear friends,

As you know, this coming Sunday is Advent Sunday, the first Sunday of a New Christian Year. Over the past year we have been reflecting on the life and teaching of Jesus as it is presented in Luke's Gospel. From Sunday (Year A) we tackle Matthew's account. To mark the season of Advent we have some extra devotions.

This Advent Sunday at 5.30pm is 'From darkness to light'. This is a mini version of the Advent Sunday evening service at Salisbury Cathedral which begins with the lighting of a single candle and ends with a Cathedral full of light. I've taken the bare bones of that service and made it a little more modest for our situation. Basically, it is an invitation to hear and ponder the Word of God in a gesture of prayerful silence. Why not come along?

Advent 2 at 5.30pm sees our usual BCP Evening Prayer before the Blessed Sacrament.

Advent 3 is the Christingle Service, and Advent 4, a **Christmas Procession of Carols and Readings.** In addition to these opportunities is a **weekly** Saturday Holy Hour, with Mass at 10am and silent prayer before the sacrament until 11am. Those who attend will be rewarded with coffee at the Vicarage! And why not try to attend a weekday service as your Advent discipline and be part of the daily prayer of our community?

Whatever you decide to do the Advent call is to 'watch' and 'keep awake'. Please don't be like those people who turned up at the wedding banquet with no spare oil!







12 Hour Prayer and Fasting for inHope 6am – 6pm Tuesday 29th November 2022 Carpenter House, Stapleton Road, Easton BS5 0QY

The Trustees and staff of inHope have called a 12 hour period of prayer and fasting as we corporately seek the Lord.

This time of prayer and fasting will give opportunity to come before God and seek His presence and deep work in our lives, inviting the Lord to reveal His good and perfect will for us, both corporately for inHope, and individually. There will be times for quiet reflective prayer, creative activities, and times of praise and worship during the 12 hours. We will punctuate the day with a 'call to prayer' at the top of each hour; these will be led by different people.

What each individual elects to fast from during this time is a personal decision, guided by God.

We invite you to join us, either in person at any time during the 12 hour period, or from where you are, in this act of worship to the God who established inHope (as Crisis Centre Ministries originally). We will share an outline guide for the period of prayer on or before Monday 28th November.

If you are not able to join us in person but have a picture, scripture or other prophetic word that you are being prompted to share with us please e-mail it to: <u>prayer@inhope.uk</u> during the 12 hour period or in the days which follow.

On 29th November our services and offices will be closed. Alternative food provision is available via other agencies as usual for a Tuesday.

We are sharing this message with supporters, supporters, intercessors and churches that we are connected with to invite others in.
