

Words from Fr Brendan Clover

Dear friends,

Thank you so much for your good wishes following the announcement last Sunday that, at some point in the future, I am to be instituted as Vicar of St John's. You have all played a part in this decision, and I thank you for all the support you have given me.

Please don't forget that we have our first Affinity Parishes service at 4pm on Sunday, the Feast of Pentecost, at All Saints Weston-super-Mare, BS23 2NL. There is plenty of parking on the streets around the church and if you intend to be there and have free seats in your car, please offer them to others. We could do this by WhatsApp. The service is followed by a chance to get to know one another over refreshments as we look to the future as one benefice. The Holy Spirit is first and foremost a Creator Spirit, hence Pentecost is also a feast of creation. For us Christians the world is the fruit of an act of love by God who has made all things and in which he rejoices to call it 'good', it is 'very good' as the creation narrative in Genesis One tells us. Consequently, God is not totally Other, unnamable and obscure. God reveals himself; he has a face. God is reason, God is will, God is joy, God is love, God is beauty. Faith in the Creator Spirit, and faith in the Spirit whom the Risen Christ gave to the Apostles and gives to each one of us, are therefore inseparably united. Sunday's Gospel offers us a marvelous image to clarify the connection between Jesus, the Holy Spirit and the Father; the Holy Spirit is portrayed as the breath of the Risen Jesus Christ. Here the Evangelist takes up an image of the creation story, where it says that God breathed into the nostrils of man the beath of life. The breath of God is life. Now the Lord breathes into our souls the new breath of life, the Holy Spirit, his most intimate essence, and by this welcomes us into God's family. That's why some call Pentecost the 'Birthday of the Church'.






Fund Raise as You Shop

There will be space for you to bring your questions and contribute your reflections.

Mike Haslam is animated by faith, family, friends [including furry ones] and fell-running. He is Chaplaincy Adviser and Acting Mission Development Team Leader for the Diocese of Bath and Wells and Co-Chair of the Church of England Diocesan Chaplaincy Leads Group. He will be joined by a panel of chaplains from the Portishead Deanery and surrounding area.
