

Words from Fr Brendan Clover

Dear friends,

No Christian is solitary. Through baptism we become members one of another in Christ, members of a company of saints whose mutual belonging transcends death. All Saints' Day and the Commemoration of the Faithful Departed on All Souls' Day both celebrate this mutual belonging.

All Saints' Day celebrates men and women in whose lives the Church as a whole has seen the grace of God powerfully at work. It is an opportunity to give thanks for that grace, and for the wonderful ends to which it shapes a human life; it is a time to be encouraged by the example of the saints and to recall that sanctity may grow in the ordinary circumstances, as well as the extraordinary crises, of human living. The Commemoration of the Faithful Departed celebrates the saints in a more local and intimate key. It allows us to remember with thanksgiving before God those whom we have known more directly: those who gave us life, or who nurtured us in faith.

Redemption is a work of God's grace; it is God who redeems us in Christ and there is nothing to be done beyond what Christ has done. But we still wait for the final consummation of God's new creation in Christ; those who are Christ's, whether or not they have passed through death, are joined in prayer that God's kingdom will be revealed finally and in all its fullness. We also sense that it is a fearful thing to come before the unutterable goodness and holiness of God, even for those who are redeemed in Christ; that it is searing as well as life-giving to experience God's mercy; and this instinct also is expressed in the liturgy of All Souls' Day.

Could you represent St Johns on the council of Churches Together in Clevedon?

There are 12 Clevedon Churches in CtiC, and together we are able to achieve things which would not be possible alone. For instance it was Churches Together which set up the Food Bank, and before that Clevedon Care, although both are now independent charities. Currently the biggest project is the chaplains. You may see them in the town centre or in the Hill Road area, wearing their grey sweatshirts. They are members of local churches who have been trained to offer support to local businesses and market stall holders. We also support Changing Lives and YMCA, and refugees in Clevedon.

CtiC organises united events such as the Good Friday service in Queens Square.

The council meets 6 times a year, when representatives from all the member churches get together to share what is happening in the town and discuss the way forward. It is always interesting and sometimes inspirational to meet representatives from the other churches and hear what they are doing. I have been representing St Johns for a number of years, and have loved doing it, but find I can no longer manage the meetings.



Some news from Martin.....

Replacement boiler works and Ukrainian visitors

If you have wondered what has gone on at the south west corner of the church over the last few weeks, then please read on.

A mains water supply (the blue pipe) has been installed into the boiler room by local Clevedon company, TP Services Limited, see photo opposite. The new water supply is needed for a replacement boiler which is due to be installed in November as the existing boiler (the red item in the photo) has more than reached the end of its life being made in 1991. A hole was "core" drilled into the boiler room / bell tower for the blue pipe in the photo, originally it was thought that the thickness of wall to be drilled was about 600mm (2' in imperial units), it turned out that the actual thickness was 1650mm (5' 6") which must have been the foundation.



By total chance whilst waiting for the core driller to arrive one Friday morning, three women approached the church looking to enter and admire the inside. I opened the church for them learning who they were, a British host, a young Ukrainian woman (who was staying in the UK away from war) and her mother who was visiting at the time. They were really engaged by our church building, its history, and its windows. The candle with the Ukrainian flag colours adjacent to the statue of Our Lady was not lost upon our visitors which goes to show that by supporting others far away or nearby really does make a difference.
