We have decided to produce the readings for you to take away and refer to during the week and we will use a publication from the Redemptorist Press. On the reverse of that weekly readings sheet will be the day-to-day information about services, the sick and departed, and church events.

Four times each year an Affinity Supplement will be produced for both of our parishes. The four times are:

Advent and Christmas

Lent and Holy Week

Easter to Pentecost

Pentecost to All Saints

These publications will contain information about the liturgical seasons and the way in which we, as Affinity Parishes, will observe them.

Wells Cathedral Parish Pass

You may have seen in the news, that Wells Cathedral has announced changes to its admission guidelines with free passes for parishioners in the Diocese of Bath and Wells and local people, and a new entry charge for tourists.

Entry remains free to enter for worship, prayer, and to light a candle and free passes are available for parishioners in the diocese. Information about the Parish Pass and how to apply for it is available from the Wells passes section of the Wells Cathedral website. You will note that the application form for a Parish Pass does require a signature from a churchwarden or incumbent.




Bach and Handel: Happy Christmas!

Often lumped together, and therefore assumed to be similar in outlook, Bach and Handel inhabited entirely different cultural worlds, even though born in the same year and country. Bach was the serious church musician, and Handel the flamboyant internationally acclaimed composer of operas. Hardly surprising, then, that their celebration of Christmas would be so very different.

Martin Firth illustrates how each composer has contributed music to celebrate the Nativity with excerpts from Handel's 'Messiah' and Bach's 'Christmas Oratorio'.

The talk will last less than an hour in our newly-warmed church, and followed by refreshments.

Some thoughts on Hymnody from our Organist Dr Martin Firth

"Let everything that hath breath, praise the Lord" (Ps150). Well, the congregation at St. John's certainly seem to do that. Even sitting on the organ stool far removed from the congregation, I hear you all singing — 'lustily' is perhaps an inappropriate term, but you get the idea. But why do we sing hymns at all, and what is a hymn anyway? The word is derived from both Latin and Greek — both meaning a song of praise, and the psalms in particular encourage us to 'Sing to the Lord'.

A hymn enriches our liturgy in many ways: it enables us to join in fellowship with a common purpose – a corporate act, a coming together of individuals. Hymns are, in a sense, a way of praying aloud together. Of course, we do this in those parts of the Mass in which we all sing, but the hymns reflect the tenor of the service, and the texts put the flesh on the bones of the Ordinary of the Mass.

The texts will serve to structure the service – processional, offertory, communion, etc., and will celebrate the readings or special occasion as necessary. And the tunes which we use: where are these from? Many are hymn specific – we could hardly use the tune for 'O God our help in ages past' for any other set of words, or 'O come all ye faithful' for that matter, though their metres would quite happily fit any number of other texts. Other tunes are more utilitarian and are used interchangeably with different texts.

The tunes themselves are largely post Reformation, and many hundreds written in the 19th Century. Martin Luther was clearly of the school of thought that "Why should the Devil have all the best tune?" and happily pressed into service any number of secular tunes of the time. You may be shocked to learn that the Passion Chorale ('O sacred head, sore wounded'), which we sing most reverentially in Passiontide, is known to have been adapted from a love song, and there is strong evidence that it was a bawdy drinking song in Hamburg long before that. (And how interesting that it forms the basis of Paul Simon's famous song 'Bridge over Troubled Water'.)
